Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) • 800.848.5533

Assists income-eligible pregnant women for a healthy pregnancy and baby.

- Home visits
- Education about parenting, pregnancy, infant growth and development
- Referrals

Participation guidelines:

- Live in a qualifying city
- Must join before 28th week of pregnancy
- First pregnancy



Early On Program • 800.848.5533

A collaborative early intervention program with Oakland Schools for children ages 0-3 years with a developmental delay or established health condition or parent concern.

- Infant-toddler growth and development assessments
- Case management, education and referrals
- Individualized family service plan
- No financial cost to family; no income eligibility



Children's Special Health Care Services

Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS) • 248.858.0056

Assists families with children and young adults through age 26 with qualifying severe, chronic health issues or disability, and adults with certain diagnoses.

- Payment assistance for medical care, equipment, and medication
- Connections to community resources
- Families of all incomes eligible to apply

Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention • 800.848.5533

- Blood lead testing for children ages 1 & 2 in WIC offices and some community events
- Case management services available to assist with lead poisoning prevention based on test results
- Detects, mitigates and prevents lead poisoning

WIC (Women, Infants & Children) • 248.858.1272

For income-eligible pregnant and breastfeeding women, new parents, infants, and children under age five.

- Benefits for healthy food
- Nutrition education and counseling
- Breastfeeding support/resources
- Referrals to community services



Nurturing Parenting Program (NPP) • 800.848.5533

A parenting education program tailored to each family's needs.

- 16 weekly home visits with a Public Health Nurse
- Growth and development screening and monitoring
- Health education
- Referrals

Water Programs

Ensures the safety of water resources and areas where people drink and interact with water to prevent disease and protect public health.

- Monitors and samples groundwater in contamination areas
- Issues private, public (Type II and III), and geothermal well permits
- Inspects well installations and conduct water sampling
- Completes sanitary surveys of non-community public water supplies
- Tests drinking water, public swimming pools, and public beach water
- Reviews private water sample test results and provide consultation
- Inspects public swimming pools and spas



Shelter and Prevention Programs

Regulates and inspects areas where people live and work to reduce exposure to pests, chemicals and disease.

- Provides testing options, information, and consultation for mercury, and radon concerns in residential housing
- Provides pest control information and consultation
- Inspects licensed day care centers, adult foster homes, group homes, and public campgrounds
- Performs plan reviews for daycare and childcare facilities
- Inspects and issues licenses for Body Art establishments
- Trains and issues permits to Body Art Practitioners



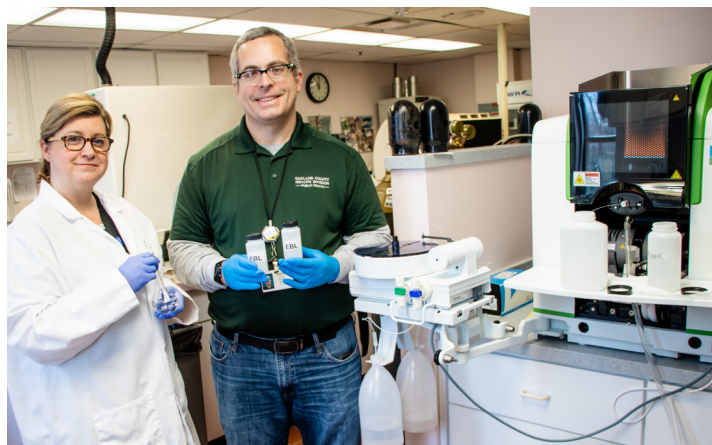

Land Programs

Ensures proper treatment of on-site sewage and protects waste from being directed inappropriately to our water resources to prevent illness.

- Evaluates soil and issues permits for on-site sewage disposal systems
- Reviews commercial and residential on-site sewage disposal system installation proposals
- Evaluates proposed land developments utilizing on-site sewage disposal and/or water wells
- Inspects and monitors licensed septage hauler vehicles and receiving facilities



Food Safety Program

Works to prevent fraud, contamination, and illness by regulating and licensing food service establishments.

- Licenses and inspects restaurants, festival food booths, and food trucks
- Conducts plan reviews for food service establishments
- Investigates foodborne illness outbreaks and complaints
- Food safety education for food service managers, staff, and others

Special Programs

- Traps, screens, and reports on mosquitoes and ticks
- Assesses sources of potential lead exposure in children with elevated blood lead levels
- Investigates potential environmental exposures to Legionella
- Educates the public on harmful algal blooms, vapor intrusion & PFAS
- Verifies compliance with medical waste producers



Dental Program • 248.858.1306

- Basic dental services for one year for income-eligible residents and veterans of Oakland County without dental insurance
- No-cost dental screenings for preschool and school-age children via the Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment program

Immunizations • 800.848.5533

Provides immunizations for all ages at our North and South Oakland Health Centers and various community events throughout the County.

- Walk-in only
- Routine vaccinations for all ages
- Flu (seasonal)

- Confidential HIV counseling
- Treatment referrals and linkage to care

- Assistance with medication coverage

Harm Reduction Services • 248.858.1729

Helps people who use drugs to reduce transmission of bloodborne pathogens, opiate-related deaths, and needle stick injuries to themselves and first responders.

- Needle exchange, Narcan distribution, and referral to substance use treatment
- Wound care
- Free and confidential Hep C, HIV, and STI testing
- No eligibility requirements
- Walk-in opportunities available at 48980 Woodward Ave, Pontiac

Tuberculosis Control

- Walk-in testing
- Treatment, counseling, and case management for latent TB and active TB case
- Chest x-ray for residents with positive TB tests
- TB clearance for employment, school, and immigration



Hearing and Vision • 248.424.7070

- No-cost screenings for preschool and school-age children
- Treatment referrals for preschool and school-age children

Health Education • 800.848.5533

Health promotion programs, presentations, and resources available for various health topics, including: substance use prevention, disease prevention, injury & violence prevention, healthy eating, and more.
