 - B. Spills Report: There was a natural gas pipeline release in Lake Orion, an alcohol release to a storm sewer in Auburn Hills, and a CO2 leak in Royal Oak

Update from OCEM (Nancy Johnston): Nancy Johnston presented a county map of off-site response plans showing plans due July 1, four newly identified facilities above threshold planning quantities, and spill notifications; she estimated roughly 260 regulated sites total and reported about 35% of Section 302 off-site response plans have been received.
