Apple Cider Pressing

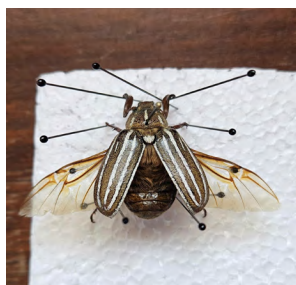
Sat. Oct. 24, 10 a.m.-Noon & 2-4 p.m.

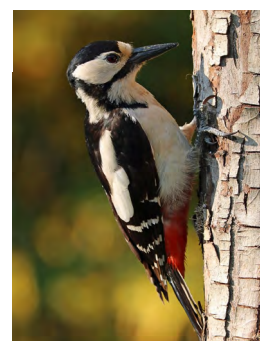

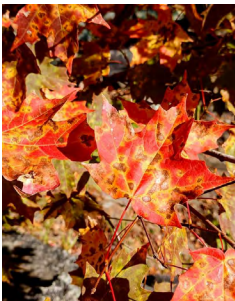
